


OFF HIGHWAY VEHICLES (OHV)

Each year, thousands of people visit Alberta's forests to enjoy their stunning, natural beauty while taking part in a number of recreational activities. Unfortunately, increased recreational activity has contributed to an increase in the number of wildfires. In Alberta, four out of every 10 wildfires are caused by human activity. As the popularity of OHVs increases, so do the number of wildfires they cause.

Many people don't realize that OHVs can start wildfires. The exhaust system on OHVs can heat up to temperatures in excess of 204°C. At these temperatures any debris, such as grass, located near the exhaust can ignite. This smouldering debris can then fall from the OHV and potentially start a wildfire.

To reduce the risk:

- Before you ride, inspect your OHV and clear out any debris that has built up near the exhaust and under the seat.
- After riding through muskeg or tall grassy areas, stop and remove any potential fire starting debris. Dispose of hot debris safely by making sure it is extinguished.
- Always carry a small fire extinguisher and collapsible shovel.
- Wash your OHV regularly and stay out of streams and creeks.

RULES FOR RURAL GARBAGE DUMPSTERS

Garbage dumpsters placed at various locations throughout the M.D. of Bonnyville are intended for bagged household garbage and flattened cardboard only. Recently there has been a large quantity of illegal waste deposited in these dumpsters. Fines for placing prohibited waste in dumpsters are \$100 for the first offence and \$200 for the second offence. Prohibited waste should be hauled to the nearest landfill.

Some of the items (such as old propane tanks) being deposited in the dumpsters are creating a potentially explosive situation in the truck that empties these dumpster and hauls waste to a landfill. Prohibited waste includes: tree branches and leaves; hay, straw, grain and baler twine; garden waste that can be composted; furniture and household appliances; large boxes; carpet; construction material; hazardous goods or wastes of any kind; automobile parts of any kind; tires or wheel rims; oil, antifreeze or batteries; ashes from wood stoves or fireplaces; dead animals or animal parts.

Members of the public that witness the unlawful depositing of materials, such as propane tanks, are asked to report such activity to the M.D.'s Public Safety Officers at 812-3332 by providing the license plate number of the vehicle used in such activity. Callers may remain anonymous. By reporting the activity you may assist in ensuring that the use of the dumpsters remain an option for your residential area.

Remember, dumpsters are placed in the rural areas for the collection of bagged household garbage and continued abuse of that privilege by a few individuals may result in the removal of the bins, forcing everyone to haul their garbage to a landfill.
